WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY - JANUARY 18-25

On the night before He died on the cross for our salvation, Jesus prayed at the Last Supper, "Father, I pray that all may be one as you are in me and I in you. I pray that they may be one in us, that the world may believe that you have sent me." Jn.17:20

This year the theme for the week of prayer for Christian Unity is RECONCILIATION: THE LOVE OF CHRIST COMPELS US. (2 Cor 5:14-20.) As 2017 is the 500th anniversary of the Reformation, begun by Martin Luther, we pray that Christians all over the world will be reconciled to Christ and to each other. Reconciliation is a gift from God, intended for the entire creation. "God was reconciling the world (cosmos) to God's self in Christ, not counting people's sins against them. And He has committed to us the message of reconciliation" (v.19). As a result of God's action, those who have been reconciled in Christ are called in turn to proclaim this reconciliation in word and deed: "The love of Christ compels

The traditional period in the northern hemisphere for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is January 18-25. Those dates were proposed in 1908 by Servant of God Fr. Paul Wattson, SA, Founder of the Society of the Atonement, to cover the original days of the feasts of the Chair of St. Peter (January 18) and the Conversion of St. Paul (January 25), and therefore have a symbolic significance. Especially this week, let us pray fervently that all peoples will be reconciled to Christ Our Lord.

PRAY TO END ABORTIONS

"Only with prayer - prayer that storms the heavens for justice and mercy, prayer that cleanses our hearts and souls - will the culture of death that surrounds us today be replaced with a culture of life." (Pastoral Plan for Pro-Life Activities, U.S. Catholic Bishops.) Prayer is the foundation of all that we do in defense of human life. Say a short prayer or devote some time to pray a Holy Hour before the Blessed Sacrament that all may hold Life sacred.

Since the Roe vs. Wade Decision of the U. S. Supreme Court in January 1973, there have been over 55 million abortions in the United States -- 55 million innocent babies killed. On this 44th anniversary of that decision, we pray for an end to abortion, the violent attack on human life. The National Right to Life March will take place on Friday, January 27 in Washington, D.C.

Locally, there will be A MARCH FOR LIFE in Plattsburgh on SUNDAY, JANUARY 22. All are welcome to participate. The March for Life will begin at 12:45 PM at St. John 23rd Newman Center in Plattsburgh. The March of Life will proceed to St. John the Baptist Church where a Program will take place at 1 PM. The guest speaker will be Dale Barr, a Mom and nurse from Cornwall, Ontario. Dale has been active in SILENT NO MORE AWARENESS CAMPAIGNS as a regional coordinator for Eastern Ontario. As a teenager, Dale had an abortion. She's shared her story at the Washington, D.C. and Ottawa, ON March for Life Rallies. Dale is married and mother of four on earth and one in heaven, All are welcome to join the March and presentation at St. John's Church in Plattsburgh. Reception will follow in the parish center.

WHAT IS A purpose-driven life? Sometimes, the meaning only becomes clear after an experience makes us look back at seemingly unrelated decisions that made us who we are. It's that "ah-ha" moment. The gospel today describes John the Baptist's "ah-ha" moment. Until that day, John had been following a path he couldn't quite see clearly, wandering the wilderness, preaching of the Son of God whom he might never even meet in the flesh. John was a recluse who attracted a huge following. These followers believed his wrath-inflicting Messiah would be the political ruler they had been waiting for. But the meaning of John's life decisions became clear in his meeting with Jesus. The heavens literally opened and God spoke to him! Jesus' ministry would be non-political and characterized by love. Jesus was the one for whom John was preparing the way, and John's future was forever changed by Jesus. The purpose of our lives may not always be as dramatically revealed to us as John's was by God. Some of us may feel lost, wandering in our own wilderness. But recognizing the need to search is the first brave step toward finding that purpose.
