ST. THOMAS AQUINAS - FEAST ON JANUARY 28

This week we celebrate the feast of St. Thomas Aquinas. Although he was nicknamed "The Dumb Ox" by his classmates, Thomas proved to be one of the most brilliant theologians and teachers in the Church. His deep love for Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament where he spent hours in quiet prayer prepared him for the great works of the *SUMMA THEOLOGICA*, as well for composing such beautiful Benediction hymns as *Pange Lingua*, *Tantum Ergo*, *and Adoro Te Devote*.

FEBRUARY 2--CANDLEMAS DAY, FEAST OF THE PURIFICATION OF MARY AND THE PRESENTATION OF JESUS IN THE TEMPLE

Forty days have passed since we celebrated the birth of Christ. Candlemas Day brings the celebration of Christmas to an end. The Presentation of Jesus in the Temple by his parents is a festival of the Lord, and also the occasion of the purification of the Virgin Mary in accordance with the requirements of the Law.(*Leviticus* 12) Simeon's prophecy that a sword will pierce the soul of the Mother of Jesus looks ahead to the crucifixion. The feast is therefore a bridge between the Nativity and the Passion. On February 2nd our priest will bless candles to be used in the Church and also to remind us that Christ is the Light of the world. We take blessed candles home with us to spread Christ's light to our family.

BLESSING OF THROATS

Next weekend there will be a special Blessing of Throats at all Masses. February 3rd is the feast of St. Blaise, a Bishop of Armenia who is patron of those suffering throat diseases.

In a time of persecution of Christians, Bishop Blaise was martyred. While enroute to prison, he was met by a frantic woman holding up her little child who was choking to death on a fishbone. Blaise blessed the boy and he was healed. God has worked many miracles through the intercession of St. Blaise.

In our present *Roman Ritual*, the priest prays, "Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."
