SIXTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE SICK, FEAST OF OUR LADY OF LOURDES

On this Sixth Sunday of Ordinary Time, we witness the infinite compassion of Jesus, who healed a man suffering the terrible disease of leprosy. On February 11, we also celebrate the feast of *Our Lady of Lourdes* who shared that compassion for millions of sick persons at the Shrine of Lourdes. This *World Day of Prayer for the Sick* calls each one of us to do our part in bringing compassionate care and prayer to the sick in our own community at Akwesasne.

But, we cannot give to others what we do not experience ourselves. We cannot give compassion unless we have received it from Jesus. We have had the misfortune of falling into sin, sometimes into serious sin. What we sinners need is the faith and confidence of the leper in today's Gospel. He believed firmly in the power and mercy of Jesus to heal him. "If you will, you can make me clean." Jesus does will our salvation. His incarnation and His death on the cross, prove that. The fact that he left the power to forgive sins to his Church is another proof of both his will and desire to help us. "All power has been given to me in heaven and on earth," he stated. Part of that power which he left to his Church is in the Sacrament of Penance where the leprosy of sin can be washed away and we can be restored to new and perfect spiritual health. What folly for any Christian then, to commit sin and isolate himself, like the unclean leper, from God! But it is greater folly still, to remain in that unclean state when the cure is so easily available to any sincere penitent in the confessional.

"Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return. Repent and believe in the Gospel."

With these words the blessed ashes are placed in the Sign of the Cross on our forehead. The ashes are a reminder that our years, our days, our minutes are numbered in God's plan for our life on earth. Death is always at the door! This holy season of Lent is another chance to receive merciful forgiveness for all the sins we regret -- all the past failures to love God with our whole heart and soul and to love our neighbor as ourselves.

It is a coincidence that this year's Ash Wednesday is also **ST. VALENTINE'S DAY** when we express our love for others. Broken hearts, broken families, broken promises, broken lives call forth the need for God's loving forgiveness. *It is time to repent, to forgive and to be forgiven. We seek healing from Jesus during this Lent*
