FEAST OF SAINT PHILIP, MAY 3, 2017

Our St. Regis parish has many families named after Saint Philip. Philip came from Bethsaida, the town of Peter and Andrew and joined them in becoming a disciple of Jesus. It was Philip who persuaded Nathaniel to COME AND SEE, when he expressed doubt that anything good could come out of Nazareth. Nathaniel (Bartholomew) too became one of the twelve apostles.

At the Last Supper, Philip asked Jesus, "Master, show us the Father and that will be enough for us." His question opened up a great revelation by Jesus, "Have I been with you for so long a time and you still do not know me, Philip? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. . . . Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me....Amen, Amen, I say to you whoever believes in me will do the works that I do, and will do greater ones than these, because I am going to the Father. And whatever you ask in my name I will do, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If you ask anything of me in my name, I will do it."

Philip truly listened to this command of Jesus and became a great apostle to the Greeks, who martyred him. We celebrate the feast of St. James, son of Alpheus, on the same day as St. Philip because James was also an apostle and martyr. The relics of both of these saints were brought to Rome and entombed in the Church of the Holy Apostles on the same day, May 3rd.

May all who bear the names of Philip or James be as courageous in witnessing to Christ as were their holy patrons!
