WE THANK GOD FOR ALL MOTHERS, LIVING AND DECEASED

On this Mother's Day when we show our special love for our Mother, we thank God for this wonderful gift and beg Him to shower His blessings on all mothers.

It is good to recall the origin of the celebration of a day to honor mothers. Mother's Day began as an event to encourage peace and bring people together in the aftermath of the Civil War in America. Ann Jarvis, who lost four of her children in the Civil War organized Mother's Friendship Day in West Virginia to peacefully bring together soldiers and neighbors. Julia Ward Howe, author of the "Battle Hymn of the Republic" in which she noted the results of war -- maimed and dead soldiers, disease, widows, and orphans - begged women to unite to celebrate the end of all war in a Mother's Day for Peace.

CENTENNIAL FEAST OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA, MAY 13

This year on Mother's Day we also celebrate the 100th anniversary of the Blessed Virgin's appearance to three little shepherd children at Fatima, Portugal. She asked them to bring to the world her message to end all wars and pray the Rosary for peace.

Here at St. Regis Church this weekend, we have the May Crowning to show our love for the Mother of Jesus and our Mother. We beg Our Blessed Mother to bring God's gift of Peace to our hearts, our families, our country, the whole world.

As our Holy Father Pope Francis celebrates Holy Mass at Our Lady's basilica in Fatima on this centennial, he will also canonize the two little children, Francisco and Jacinta Marto, chosen by Mary to deliver her special message to pray the rosary for peace.

Francisco Marto, born at Fatima on June 11, 1908, died of influenza on April 4, 1919. Jacinta Marto, born at Fatima, Portugal, March 11, 1910 died of influenza on February 20, 1920. The Virgin Mary asked them to pray the Rosary and to sacrifice for the conversion of sinners. Before she died at age 9, Jacinto said, "In Heaven I'm going to love Jesus very much, and the Immaculate Heart of Mary too."

Many miracles have been granted through the intercession of Jacinta and Francisco. As they are canonized this week, let us pray:

O God who granted these two shepherd children the grace to become little burning bushes on fire with love for Jesus, for Our Blessed Mother and for sinners, grant that we, too, like Francisco and Jacinta, may burn with the same love and, some day meet together in Heaven around Our Lady in adoration of the Blessed Trinity. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son. Amen.
