CONSECRATING CANADA TO THE IMMACULATE HEART OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

The Catholic Conference of Catholic Bishops of Canada will consecrate the country to the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary as part of the celebrations marking the 150th anniversary of Confederation on July 1, 2017. On Saturday, July 1 at the 5 P.M. Mass at St. Finnan's Cathedral in Alexandria, Archbishop Terrence consecrated Diocese Prendergast the of Alexandria/Cornwall to Mary. On September 26, Feast of the Canadian Martyrs, all the bishops in the Plenary Session will jointly consecrate Canada to Mary's intercession.

The prayer of consecration is as follows:

Mary our Mother, may the Cross of your Son planted on Canadian soil and in Canadian hearts, be known as the Tree of Life, whose fruit is visible and available to all in the garden of this world.

Mary our Mother, we place our country in the sanctuary of your Holy Heart for we know that there we will find JESUS, who lives and reigns with the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. AMEN.

JULY 16 - FEAST OF OUR LADY OF MOUNT CARMEL AND THE BROWN SCAPULAR

Scripture celebrated the beauty of Carmel where the prophet Elijah defended the purity of Israel's faith in the living God. In the twelfth century hermits withdrew to that mountain and later founded the religious order of Carmelites devoted to the contemplative life under the patronage of Mary, Mother of God.

The small brown scapular that Catholics wear is a sacramental and sign of Mary's protection. According to a 1996 doctrinal statement approved by the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, "Devotion to Our Lady of Mount Carmel is bound to the history and spiritual values of the Order of the Brothers of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Mount Carmel and is expressed through the scapular. Thus, whoever receives the scapular becomes a member of the order and pledges him/herself to live according to its spirituality in accordance with the characteristics of his/her state in life.

Many of us at an early age were enrolled in the Scapular. Enrollment carries on throughout our whole life, even if our brown scapular has worn out and we have a new one. It is good to recall the words of Investiture: Receive this Scapular, a sign of your special relationship with Mary, the Mother of Jesus, whom you pledge to imitate. May it be a reminder to you of your dignity as a Christian, in serving others and imitating Mary. Wear it as a sign of her protection and of belonging to the Family of Carmel, voluntarily doing the will of God and devoting yourself to building a world true to his plan of community, justice and peace.

At various apparitions, Our Blessed Mother has promised her special care, especially at the hour of death, for those who wear her scapular and live according to its significance.

Though we cannot escape suffering, Jesus assures us that we are not alone in carrying out burdens if we take his yoke and learn from him. The metaphor of the yoke Jesus uses likely refers to a wooden crosspiece used on the necks of two animals as a means of pulling the plough or cart. In this sense, Jesus will carry our crosses with us, side by side, when we cannot bear the load of our sufferings on our own. When the alternative is distress and despair, may we turn to our gracious and merciful God to help us find rest through living and learning Jesus' humble, gentle and compassionate way.
