WHEN I FEEL overwhelmed by the prospect of doing God's will, I find comfort in knowing that God is in that moment with me. I am not being asked to move mountains alone. I am being offered more love and grace than I could ever fathom. Like David, Solomon, Paul and the disciples, I am only being asked to open myself up to that love. God invites us into his love and prepares us to love; and by grace we come to love God's commands. Solomon is keenly aware of God's love; filled with grace, he desires to govern well and care for God's people. Turning to God, Šolomon offers himself as God's servant – wishing to discern between good and evil. Ās Paul explains in his letter to the Romans, we are all "predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son." God's grace is always operative in us so that we come to share in God's purpose. God is the first mover and we are invited to be partners in mission. When God calls, will I say "YES"? The joy of responding to God's call is more wonderful than a hidden treasure or a fine pearl. By grace may we sell the things that are holding us back from saying YES! For those who love God are called, justified and glorified.
