# CELEBRATION OF THE CANONIZATION OF ST. KATERI TEKAKWITHA

We will celebrate a special Mass to thank God for St. Kateri Tekakwitha who was canonized in Rome on October 21, 2012. Five years have already passed since that wonderful pilgrimage to Rome organized by Matt Rourke and his family. Let us have a great reunion of all who made that journey to honor our own Saint Kateri. There will be a special 5th Anniversary Mass at 4 PM on Saturday, October 21, 2017 Encourage all your friends who traveled on the pilgrimage to Rome to come together again to thank God for St. Kateri, and to enjoy a potluck dinner at the St. Kateri Tekakwitha Center.

#### BE A SAINT!

This week is packed full of **ordinary** women and men who said, "YES! to God and became His **extraordinary** friends.

- **ST. TERESA OF AVILA** (October 15), a spoiled young girl, was called to a life of mystical prayer and penance. A strong woman of faith, Teresa reformed the Carmelite Order and wrote "The Way of Perfection" and "The Interior Castle" to lead souls to union with God.
- ST. MARGUERITE D'YOUVILLE (October 16), was the first Canadian-born saint to be canonized. Born Marie-Marguerite Dufrost de Lajemmerais in Varenne, Quebec, in 1701, she was married to Francois d'Youville in 1722. They had six children, four of them dying in infancy. After her husband's death in 1730, Marguerite devoted her time to the care of the sick and the poor and founded a religious order, the Sisters of Charity of Montreal. The Grey Nuns depended on Divine Providence, to found orphanages, schools, and hospitals.
- **ST. HEDWIG OF BAVARIA** (October 20), wife of Duke Henry of Silesia, raised seven children, while helping the poor and prisoners, and founding monasteries and hospitals.
- **ST. MARGARET MARY** (October 20) after years of illness was cured and entered the Visitation Order. God chose her to establish devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.
- **ST. IGNATIUS OF ANTIOCH, MARTYR** (October 17) bravely preached the Gospel of Jesus. He was imprisoned for his faith and fed to lions in Rome's amphitheater during the persecution of Christians.
- **ST.LUKE** (October 18) was a physician, chosen by God to write the third Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles. He is patron of the medical profession.
- **ST. PAUL OF THE CROSS** (October 19) was converted at the age of 15 and embraced a life of prayer and penance. He founded the religious order of Passionists.
