Each person receives his eternal retribution in his immortal soul at the very moment of death, in a particular judgment that refers his life to Christ, either entrance into the blessedness of heaven --through purification -- or immediate and everlasting damnation.

We cannot be united with God unless we freely choose to love Him. At the evening of life, we shall be judged on our love. "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul and with all your mind. You shall love your neighbor as yourself." By His death and resurrection, Jesus Christ has opened Heaven to those who love Him.

Those who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are assured of their eternal salvation, but after death they undergo purification -- Purgatory. From the beginning, the Church has honored the memory of the dead and has offered the Eucharistic Sacrifice for the souls in Purgatory so that they may attain the beatific vision of God.
